

# BURN PERMIT

Terms: Ken Whiteman may burn yard waste / storm debris at 904 N. Chestnut.

The permitted burn dates are 8/6 – 8/7/11.

It is understood that Ken Whiteman will meet the following requirements:

- Acknowledge this permit is for a one time event.
- Keep fire suppression equipment near the fire.
- Burn only between the hours of 7:00 AM and 5:00 PM.
- No burning within 25 feet of any structure.
- All burn material must be DNR approved (yard waste only).
- This permit is revoked if “The National Weather Service” sustained or forecast wind for the area is above 12 MPH and or wind gusts are greater than 15 MPH.
- No burning in City right-of-ways or utility easements.
- All other rules and regulations of the City of Cameron code apply.

A copy of this permit will be delivered to the Cameron Public Safety Facility-Cameron Police Department and Cameron Fire Department.

**Sec. 5-33. Burning of trash.**

The burning of trash and rubbish shall not be permitted within the city limits of Cameron.  
(Code 1970, § 8-6; Ord. No. 4974, §§ 1, 2, 1-21-03)

**Sec. 5-34. Burning yard wastes.**

(a) The provisions of section 5-57(3), Prohibited Practices, to the contrary notwithstanding, within the corporate limits of Cameron, the open burning of residential yard wastes grown on a residential property is permitted during the following calendar periods and time-of-day restrictions:

- (1) The third Saturday in October through the third Saturday in April, inclusive.
- (2) A seven-day period within four (4) weeks of a weather-related event which causes an unusually large amount of natural vegetation debris to accumulate as determined by the city manager and fire chief; and
- (3) The burning shall take place only between the daytime hours of 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

(b) Open burning permitted by this section shall be subject to the following restrictions:

- (1) The minimum required distance from a structure shall be twenty-five (25) feet and the pile size shall be three (3) feet or less in diameter and two (2) feet or less in height.
- (2) If the safety of the community or the public may be endangered, the city manager may invoke a temporary burning ban.
- (3) Sufficient firefighting material to contain any fire started under this section will be at the site of the burning.
- (4) The "National Weather Service's" forecasted winds for the area do not exceed 12 MPH and or wind gusts greater than 15 MPH.
- (5) In no event shall a fire started under this section result in a building or structure catching on fire.
- (6) All fires shall be on private property and not in the public right-of-way.

(c) The city manager shall cause each declaration made by him pursuant to this section to be publicly announced by means of broadcasting on a local radio station, and he may cause such declaration to be further announced in a local newspaper when feasible. Each such announcement shall describe the action taken by the city manager, including the time it became or will become effective.

(d) The intent of this ordinance is not to require permits for, nor prohibit the use of portable outdoor fireplaces, manufactured or purpose-built fire pits or cooking grills.
